

Georgia Tech Visits Northeast High for Nanotechnology Lesson



Leslie O'Neill and Mikkel Thomas from <u>Georgia Tech</u> visited Dr. Suneetha Panda's classroom at <u>Northeast High School</u>. Central High Alum Teaches Masterclass Workshop




